Tuition and Fees

A non-refundable \$50.00 registration fee will be charged each year.

Monthly fees will be charged as follows:

Infants.....\$525.00

Toddlers....\$525.00

Twos.....\$525.00

Threes.....\$525.00

Fours.....\$520.00

Extended Day Students will be charged \$210.00 per month.

Siblings will be given 1/4 off after regular charges on the first child.

The Children's Place Preschool is planned for children ages six weeks through those who will be four years old on or before September 1. The operating hours are from 7:00a.m.-5:15p.m. Monday through Friday, twelve months a year. Classes are provided for infants, toddlers, twos, threes, and fours. We also offer an extended day program after school and throughout the summer for children who attend City schools.



Curriculum
