I trust everyone made it through this past Saturday's round of severe storms with little to no impact other than being a little sleepy on Sunday morning. While this is certainly a preview of what to expect this Spring, as I am writing to you, we are bracing for another shot of arctic cold and some wintry precipitation this week across the Tennessee Valley. Of course, you know what they say, "In Alabama, if you don't like the weather, just wait until tomorrow!" Only in the South would we experience all seasons within a matter of a week!

My girls are not fans of severe weather. As a matter of fact, if there is but a whisper of the potential for storms, they will ask to spend the night in the church basement! So, as you can imagine, Saturday was an anxious day for them. Nobody wanted to go to sleep for the night, especially Miss Emma!

Before going off to sleep, she made me promise that I would stay up and keep an eye on the weather and come and get her if it got bad. Of course, we were up with Sophia Kate anyway, so we watched the weather progress across our state. The storms were quite noisy as they approached; I kept thinking, "Well it's just a matter of time before everybody in the house is up!" Sure enough, a little after midnight, a tornado warning was issued for Jackson County and the weather sirens began blaring.

But wouldn't you know, even with all that noise from the wind, the thunder, and those loud weather sirens, those girls snoozed right through it all! Once we determined that the worst of the storm would miss us, we kicked back and hoped everyone would sleep through it, and they did!

I was reminded of the strange, yet powerful story in the Gospels about Jesus falling asleep on a boat in the middle of a storm (Luke 8:22–25; Matthew 8:23–27; Mark 4:36–41).

First of all, this story shows us the very human nature of Jesus of Nazareth. After a long day of teaching and ministering to the crowds of people, Jesus was exhausted, so he found a quiet, comfortable spot on the boat to get a "power nap" in.

So, while Jesus was snoozing, a furious storm arose on the water that threatened the vessel and its crew. Now, many of Jesus' disciples were commercial fishermen; they had certainly experienced their share of storms over the years. But, according to the Gospel texts, this was a rough one, and the disciples were scared for their very lives, so they went to wake Jesus up!

I've always found Jesus' response quite amusing. I mean, this storm was bad enough that it scared a bunch of roughneck fishermen, yet Jesus was tired (and comfortable) enough to just snooze right through it. Then, when they wake him up, he totally rebuffs them for getting scared and waking him up, like, "Seriously guys, can I just have a minute?!"

Of course, we know the rest of the story. Jesus "rebuked the wind and sea" and calmed the storm. Then he asked the crew, "Where's your faith!?" It's interesting that no one offered a response to Jesus' seemingly snarky question, and instead, they just marveled at the miracle they had witnessed.

How often have we found ourselves in that boat in our own lives? We've endured so much, we have experienced deliverance, mercy, and grace time and time again, only to look at our situation and say, "Come on Jesus! Aren't you going to do something about this!?" because we perceive that Jesus is somehow "snoozing" on us.


